Next Tuesday all teachers will be attending a webinar on Reading for Pleasure. This is the next step in our Reading journey and is being led by the Little Wandle team who are our Phonics providers. This course aims to look at developing our school's approach to Reading for Pleasure. We will join Professor Teresa Cremin as she explores how we can build communities of engaged readers. Teresa will draw upon research and examples of practice to highlight the importance of interactive reading communities. She will also explore how we can involve parents and the wider school community when building a rich reading culture. This form of training also allows us to mix and converse with professionals from a wide range of school areas including the UK.

We have had a great response to the Homework Survey so thank you very much for doing this. We have also been completing the survey with the pupils so that we have their point of view too. We are working hard on developing our pupil voice and the pupils are enjoying being part of decisions on the school.


Class 1

We are really enjoying our growing topic. Our preschoolers have really been exploring the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and have made a fabulous beanstalk including numbers, acted it out to retell the story and used giant footprints to measure. We have been growing beans and started to get potatoes ready for planting. Last week we went outside to look at plants that have been eaten by insects and drew the leaves. We also tried to guess what had eaten them. The whole class are continuing to practise their phonic skills daily and great progress is being made. We have started a new water station where the children are able to pour their own water when they need a drink, encouraging staying hydrated.











Class 2 have become a force to be reckoned with in Science, quickly becoming a brilliant group of investigative scientists, as we prepare to make our own games thinking about forces and magnets. We've finished reading and exploring our current English book and the children have moved on to planning and writing their own Friendleswylde inspired, magical tales. This has been complemented by some beautiful wintery landscapes as we've started to experiment with watercolours in Art. Over in history and PE we've moved on from learning all about the beginnings of and modern day Olympics to the history of football in all its many forms! Sarkeese lessons and Eisteddfod play preparation has been the focus in Enrichment, Martin and I are very impressed with the pronunciations and accents from all, it's certainly not an easy one to get right but these guys are achieving it!
















Class 3
