Class 1

Keep up the fantastic work, everyone!
























Class 2

In Class 2 science, we've been diving into the world of animal classification. From mammals to reptiles, birds to amphibians, the children have been sorting, grouping, and comparing animals based on their features. We've had lively discussions about habitats, diets, and life cycles. We have started to explore food webs this week also. Ask your child what makes a fish different from a bird—they're becoming real zoologists! In English, we investigated the mysterious break-in at the Three Bears' cottage! The children created brilliant wanted posters for Goldilocks, describing her golden curls, stripy leggings, and her porridge-related crimes. In History we examined Victorian books and handwriting, even having a go with a fountain pen, which was fun but a bit messy! At the moment, we are having a real push on the children's reading- they are certainly coming on and reading some really tricky books and words- so thank you for continuing to fill in their reading diaries at home!











Class 3

It has been another busy couple of weeks in Class 3!

We were really happy that the sun shone on us for our Friday treat, a trip to the outdoor classroom. There we held debates using talking objects found around the area and designed a game to be played by 6 people using nature's resources.

It has been great to watch our year 8 students grow in confidence in interacting with students around the world during their Kings InterHigh lessons. The subject knowledge is incredible already and they have all embraced this new and exciting way to study. This coupled with all the fun things available in Sark School is proving to be a winning combination.

I have really enjoyed the level of discussion and the depth of thought to be found with our Class 3 students. Whilst year 8 have been experiencing new ways to learn Geography, the same is true for years 5 and 6 students. We have been using a new teaching resource called KAPOW.
